3. Time To Go Home? – Health Watchdog seeks feedback

The North Wales Community Health Council (NWCHC), the independent health watchdog for the region, will be taking part in a national review of the length of time patients are staying within hospitals. Geoff Ryall-Harvey, Chief Officer of the NWCHC says, 'One of our roles is to keep an eye on the health services in North Wales. We know that some people end up staying in hospital even after they are well enough to leave. This can be because arrangements are not in place at home or because spaces are not available in care homes or different healthcare settings. 'We would really like to hear from anyone who has been a patient, is a relative of a patient or who cares for a patient, about any experience over the last 12 months when they have had to stay in hospital for longer than is needed.' Mr Ryall-Harvey went on to say, 'This forms part of the NWCHC's day to day work and is something that we are always looking for feedback on through our visits to health care sites and through our complaints advocacy service. We will use the information to let NHS managers and planners know what it feels like to be in hospital for too long and of what actions needs to be taken to make things better for the patient.'
