4. County Borough of Conwy (Narrow Lane / Conway Road Llandudno Junction) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 2015

The Conwy County Borough Council proposes to make an Order under Sections 1 & 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which is to:

1. Prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time in the lengths of road specified in Schedule 1
 2. Prohibit the waiting of vehicles between the hours 8am to 6pm in the length of road specified in Schedule 2. Exceptions will be provided in the proposed Order to permit waiting for the purposes of alighting, boarding, loading, unloading & works of maintenance, repair & the like. Exceptions will also be provided in the proposed Order to allow vehicles displaying both a disabled person's badge & a disabled person's parking disc to wait in length of road specified in the Schedules 1 & 2, for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same day). A copy of the proposed Order together with a map showing the length of road to which the Order relates & a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be examined at Conwy Library, & at the offices of the Head of Law and Governance, Bodlondeb, Conwy during normal opening/office hours. Objections to the proposed Order, together with the grounds on which they are made, should be sent in writing to the Head of Law & Governance, Conwy County Borough Council, Bodlondeb, Conwy, LL32 8DU by 14/10/15
- Schedule 1 (No waiting at any time.)
1. from a point 53 metres southeast of its junction with Sarn Mynach to a point 31 metres north-west of Conway Road.
 2. from its junction with Conway Road for a distance of 22 metres in a north-westerly direction. North-easterly side; from its junction with Conway Road to a point 106 metres southeast of its junction with Sarn Mynach. Conway Road, Northern side; from a point 76 metres east of its junction with Trem Yr Afon for a distance of 30 metres in an easterly

direction. Southern side; from a point 58 metres east of its junction with Trem Yr Afon for a distance of 48 metres in an easterly direction. Pen Dyffryn Both sides; from its junction with Narrow Lane for a distance of 9 metres in an easterly direction.

Schedule 2 (No waiting 8am to 6pm) Conway Road, Southern side; from a point 21 metres east of its junction with Trem Yr Afon for a distance of 37 metres in an easterly direction.
